There were so many blessings! We still have to put on new gutters and the project will fully be complete. Praise the Lord! We were also able to do some work in our sanctuary. 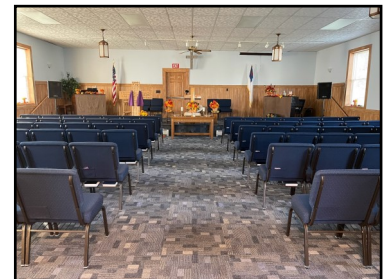

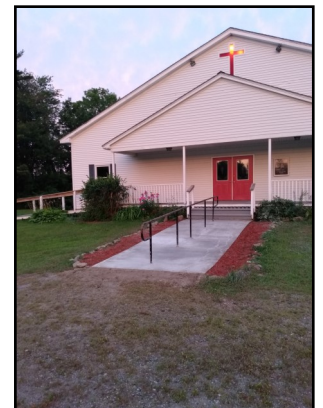

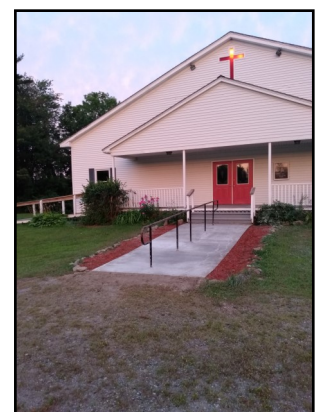

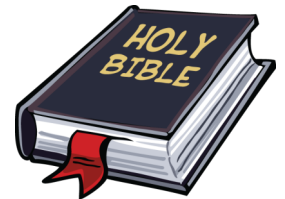
**Please Pray For Us**
