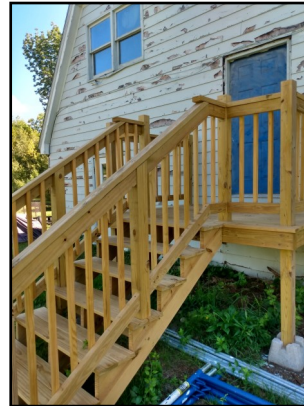

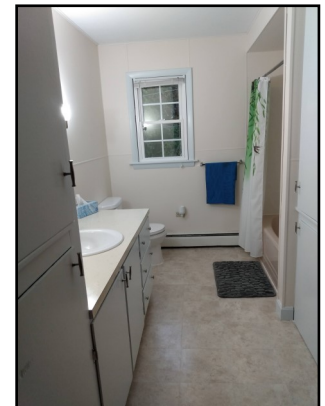

A Note from Carol Buckley



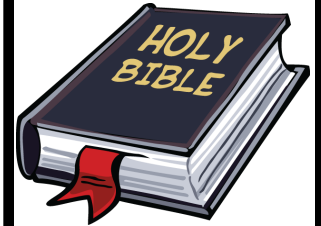
Carol with her newest Grandbabies
