


Don & Nicole King

Don and Nicole met in Paris, France while Don served with the U.S. Army. They were married in Paris, came back to the United States and settled in Ohio. Neither of them were saved at the time, but through the faithfulness of a local pastor they both came to know Jesus Christ as their Savior. Soon after they were saved, Don went to college to prepare to serve the Lord. Upon completion of college God called the Kings to be missionaries to France where they

served for 14 years. After returning to the U.S. they were instrumental in the establishment of a church in Southern New Jersey and then moved to Florida where Don was an Assistant Pastor in St. Petersburg. During the later part of 2006 the Kings contacted C.P.A., applied and were accepted. Several churches were visited and they were called to pastor the Dennison Corners Community Church near Mo-

hawk, NY. The church was revitalized under the leadership of Rob and Sue Andreas a few years ago, but in early 2006 the church was decimated by unfortunate circumstances. Tom Buckley then served as interim pastor and along with his wife, Carol, was able to stabilize the ministry. The Kings were then called and have seen growth in the short time they have been there. MISSION FAMILY NEWS




