

## Hornell Bible Church in Need of Help


It is not very often that C.P.A. is able to help a church that is only 7 miles from mission headquarters. That possibility became a reality in July 2007, when the Hornell Bible Church asked C.P.A. to provide a missionary pastor. The church had gone through several years of difficulty during which attendance decreased to about a dozen or so faithful people. Hornell is a town of over 9,000 people.

Because C.P.A. did not have a missionary family available Tom Buckley, along with his wife,

Carol, agreed to serve as the interim pastor. Filling the role of church pastor while directing C.P.A. created a full and busy life for the Buckleys. Thankfully, in late July Dan and Beth Douglas were accepted into C.P.A. as missionaries. They lived just ten miles from Hornell and after much prayer they felt God's call to the Hornell Bible Church. Before they are able to serve full time they must raise the needed support so Dan can quit his job and become the pas-

tor. During this time Tom serves as the interim pastor and Dan as the associate pastor. Together they are able to meet the needs of the church. The Douglas' are still seeking their support so pray that this will be accomplished soon.

On the last Sunday of November as Tom entered the church building he found it full of smoke. The fire department was called and fortunately it was caused by a malfunctioning furnace and there was no fire. If it had been any other day of the week, when no one would have

been in the building, there might have been a fire with disastrous results. The positive side was that the insurance company replaced the furnace, totally cleaned and painted the interior of the church, and provided for other improvements.

The Douglas' moved into the parsonage in November and anxiously pray and work toward having the needed support so they can serve full time at the Hornell Bible Church.
